





Companion on the Journey

Fasting, feasting. Dying, rising. Lent, Easter.

I am asked by new Catholics, "What should I give up for Lent?" I respond, "Give up your favorite sin;" like my annual Lenten war on lust, gluttony and pride, often sadly with little result.

This year, I thought I'd try something more achievable - like giving up chocolate. Instead I turned to the Holy Spirit and asked, "What would you have me do?" He answered, "Give up anger; and, eat to live, not live to eat."

Well, I am trying both, and what a difference! In giving up anger, which I didn't think was a problem, miracles are happening. In fact, anger might be the root cause of other vices because I am quite suddenly freed from bondage to lust, gluttony and pride. The discipline of eating to live is helping put my entire life in better order. Wow. Thank you, Holy Spirit.

But dying is only half the equation. There is also the rising. The Church encourages us always to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. So, I asked the Spirit again, "What would you have me do?" He showed me by example.

A lady named Charity recently helped me with a retreat for children and parents. During the retreat, Charity sensed in the Spirit that many of the people had great sadness. We invited those with sadness to stand. We prayed for them. Sensing deep depression, even one lady being tempted to suicide, we prayed for those with depression. Great? But here is the real lesson...

When the retreat ended, Charity immediately sought out those we had prayed for, especially that one lady - to befriend, encourage and pray with, and most of all to love, just as Christ reaches out in love to us in our need. Charity didn't ask, "How did my talk go?" She asked, "Where did the lady in the white sweater go?"

Lent - another opportunity for the Spirit to work in us the miracles of dying and rising.

Let's pray: "Holy Spirit, I want only to live in you, be guided by you, and die and rise in Christ through you. Teach me and change me in ways that lead me into a continuing daily life of dying and rising in the love of God my Savior. Thank you. Amen."

Two Special Pre-Sessions Held for CRM Leaders On Friday February 28

Special session 1: For Prayer Ministers

Father Charlie Goreieb (left) explained that the need for deliverance has grown tremendously in recent years and many priests and bishops are now trained in exorcism. The actual number of people who are really possessed are very few but the number of those needing healing and deliverance is very great. Lay people can do this kind of prayer. However, only a trained priest or bishop can do an exorcism. Our Pope would like to see us have an exorcist in every diocese and our Bishop would like to have a trained prayer team ministry for healing and deliverance in every parish. CRM now has 8 prayer rooms in parishes in the Phoenix Diocese.

Father Steve Kunkel (right) became aware of the growing need for deliverance when an incident occurred at his parish and now assists Father Charlie in interviewing people who need deliverance and possibly exorcism.



Special Session 2: The Power of Intercession

Bertha Murillo spoke to the prayer ministers about the need for intercessors for any ministry but especially for the healing and deliverance teams. She would like to have intercessors in every prayer room. Intercessors do spiritual warfare and these weapons of warfare are very powerful. They can move mountains! They under-gird the prayer ministers, work with them hand in hand, to fight for the soul of the person receiving the prayer. Their prayers bring the power and the anointing into the ministry of the prayer warriors. The two most powerful weapons are tongues and the rosary. Intercessors and prayer warriors alike must live a repented life. They must receive the sacraments often and practice humility.

Charismatic Conference Continued Prophecies Given at the Conference

CRM's Tom Beale takes Life in the Spirit Seminar to North Dakota



On February 7-9, 2014, college students from North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Iowa and Minnesota came together for a weekend Life in the Spirit Retreat. The retreat, held at the Sisters of St. Francis of the Immaculate Heart Convent and Retreat Center in Hankinson, ND was led by Tom Beale of Phoenix CRM. There is hope for our Church. The Holy Spirit is stirring our young people, and they are open to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

The New Evangelization – Part 6

The very words “New Evangelization” bring a breath-of-fresh-air excitement and energy to many people, and perhaps to the Church in general: “Time’s a wasting! Let’s get going!”

In his Apostolic Exhortation, “*Evangelii Gaudium*” (EG), the Pope leads us into first-things-first: “a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ” (EG 3), lived in heartfelt “joy that is constantly born anew.” (EG 1) He continues by suggesting other, ongoing foundational exercises: prayer and listening.

Prayer: Jesus says, “The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.” (Matthew 9:37-38) Pope Francis says, “Wherever there is life, fervor and a desire to bring Christ to others, genuine vocations will arise... This is particularly true if such a living community prays insistently for vocations and courageously proposes to its young people the path of special consecration.” (EG 107)

How insistently do you pray for vocations? How insistently does your community pray?

Listening: “To read the signs of the times it is helpful to listen to young people and the elderly. Both represent a source of hope for every people. The elderly bring with them memory and the wisdom of experience, which warns us not to foolishly repeat our past mistakes. Young people call us to renewed and expansive hope, for they represent new directions for humanity and open us up to the future, lest we cling to a nostalgia for structures and customs which are no longer life-giving in today’s world.” (EG 108)

This is about listening, not talking. I can’t control if, or how, you might listen to me. I can only control if, and how, I listen to you. Dialog, and evangelization, both begin with listening.

“Challenges exist to be overcome! Let us be realists, but without losing our joy, our boldness and our hope-filled commitment. Let us not allow ourselves to be robbed of missionary vigor.” (EG 109)

A renewed encounter with Christ, a lived joy, prayer and listening! Let’s get started. Now.

And always, we are ever learning to fish, to catch fish and to teach others to fish.

Lion of Judah Prayer Group to Celebrate Their 40th Anniversary



In the summer of 1966 a group of students at Duquesne University were in the chapel praying to the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit moved there with an outpouring of the charismatic gifts. The Holy Spirit moved very soon again in February 1967 at Notre Dame University as a group of people were praying there. From there the move of the Holy Spirit spread rapidly to other parts of the United States and Europe. People were being baptized in the Holy Spirit and their faith was set afire with the release of the spiritual gifts. In early 1970 a priest who witnessed these events moved to Phoenix and began giving Holy Spirit Seminars at the Casa.

Father Kelly, the Pastor of St. Daniel the Prophet, asked Father Larkin to speak about the Charismatic Renewal and start a prayer group with the help of his team. Madeline Warwick and her husband Jim attended the Holy Spirit Seminar at the Casa and became the first leaders of a charismatic prayer group at St. Daniel the Prophet in Scottsdale. Our prayer group had its first meeting during Lent of 1974.

On May 9, 2014, Lion of Judah Prayer group from St. Daniel the Prophet Catholic Church in Scottsdale, will be celebrating their 40th anniversary. We are the oldest Charismatic prayer group in the valley. Auxiliary Bishop Eduardo Nevares will celebrate Mass on Friday May 9 at 6:00 PM at St. Daniel’s followed by a reception for all the prayer group’s members attending.
